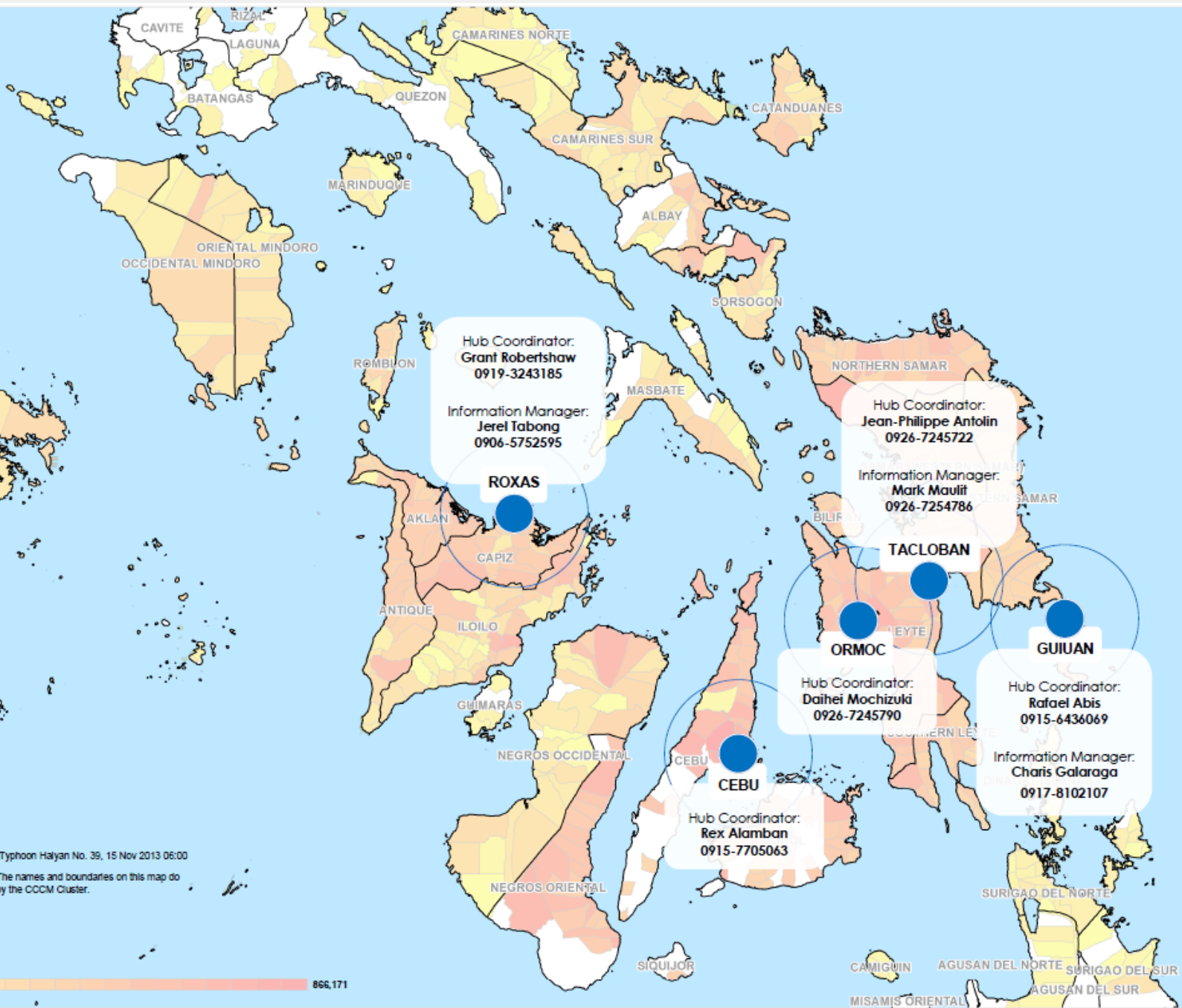

Overall Situation

- In Ormoc evacuation centres remain in small scale (1983 families)
- IDPs in rural balangay are hosted in school buildings
- 5 DTM done (initial report)

- Steady flow of population movement coming from Tacloban and using Ormoc as transit hub to travel to Cebu (approx. 5,000 per day). Concern on accomodation for people staying overnight as transportation from Ormoc to Cebu is limited – Protection of migrants

- Resttlement Plan for informal settlers
- School opening on 2 December 2013
- There are evacuation centres outside Ormoc Muncipality
