



ANALYSIS OF DTM IN AFFECTED AREAS – No.001

DMT results for Typhoon Haiyan

Date: 17 November 2014

Number of centers: 6 (Dadivas Civic Center; Dulangan Elem. School; Kasanayan Elem. School; Dona Victoria Cortes Memorial School; Pontevedra National High School; Kanangkaan Elem. School)

Total Households: 342; total person: 1,711

Shelter

- Types of shelter used are classrooms. Most of classrooms (or 83%) are very crowded or overpopulated. Other type of shelter used is public hall (civic center)

Food

- Frequency of food distribution: daily (3 centers); number of expected schedule (2 centers); no information (1 center)
- No supplementary feeding for children as well as for pregnant lactating are available yet

Water

- Insufficient water taps in all centers (6 locations)

Sanitation

- Sanitation facilities available across 6 centers are including: permanent latrines (41 units); accessible toilets (6 units, one per location); toilets accessible by Public Works Department/PWD (6 units, one per location); Bathing areas with privacy (6 units, one per location)
- Five centers have sufficient toilets; one center has insufficient toilet

Hygiene

- Garbage disposal at sites are using various methods, i.e. burn/incineration (4 centers); pick up (one center), and no information available (1 center)

Health

- Three centers confirmed that no **Surveillance in Post Extreme Emergencies and Disasters (SPEED)** was conducted by Department of Health (DoH). The remaining 3 centers has no information on this matter.
- Speed provided is for 3 centers, while 3 centers has no information provided
- Common Health Complaints in the site are including: diarrhoea, amebiasis, cough, cold flu, fever, skin diseases, injury, infected wounds, eye infection. The most common diseases facing the survivors are: cough (all centers); diarrhoea (5 centers); cold flu (5 centers)
- In terms of health services provided, 2 centers have been provided health services by Barangay Health Center and Parish of St. Joseph, 3 centers have no health services yet.

Education

- Two centers reported no informal education implemented yet. The other four centers have n/a. while other centers still have no information yet. Four centers (67%) reported that the children are at school; two centers have no information yet.

Protection

- Protection services for vulnerable are available at all sites – all six centers is providing VAW/CP sessions.
